



Student Medication Plan Stockton School 2012-13

NOTE: Stockton is working with Childrens Hospital to develop a sustainable plan for accessible medication for students. This is an ongoing process that may change throughout the year.

Students in the primary/middle grades that stay with their classrooms throughout the day:

- A medication bag holds the entire classroom's medication.
 - Each medication and device (ie. Spacer) is labeled with the child's name and kept in a clear Ziploc bag
 - Child's Emergency Action Plan (E.A.P.) is kept in the bag
 - The child's 504 / IEP is kept in the bag
- The bag goes everywhere the class goes. It is handed from teacher to teacher/adult supervisor as the class moves, i.e., teacher to playground supervisor, gym teacher, etc.
- Students 3rd grade and up can keep their own inhalers.

Students in the upper grades that have independent schedules:

- Keep their medication on their person, using a lanyard, backpack, purse, etc.
 - Secondary medications could be kept in a bag in the nurse's office or the main office
 - Each medication and device (ie. Spacer) is labeled with the child's name and kept in a clear ziplock bag
 - Child's Emergency Action Plan (E.A.P.) is kept in the bag
 - The child's 504 / IEP is kept in the bag
